

Order of Service for streamed Communion

Each week, the readings, reflection and prayers may be found on the pewsheet. The reflection can also be found as an audio-clip on the website. You may also wish to pause the service to listen to the suggested hymns.

Welcome and Introduction

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you
And also with you.

Almighty God,
**to whom all hearts are open,
all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden:
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit,
that we may perfectly love you,
and worthily magnify your holy name;
through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

We are invited to confess our failings, mistakes and sins to God, either:

Most merciful God,
**Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
we confess that we have sinned
in thought, word and deed.**

**We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.
In your mercy, forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be;
that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you, our God. Amen.**

Or with the response:

... Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**
Christ, have mercy. **Christ have mercy**
Lord, have mercy. **Lord have mercy.**

Words of forgiveness and hope, to which we respond:
Amen.

Knowing God's forgiveness and grace, we praise Him in the words of the Gloria.

Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;

you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.
Amen.

*We continue in prayer, with the **Collect** (Prayer for the week)*

We listen to readings from the Bible, which end with the response:

... This is the word of the Lord.
Thanks be to God.

The Psalm contains a response, which can be found on the pewsheet.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ,
according to (name).
Glory to you, O Lord.

And at the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
Praise to you, O Christ

Followed by a time of reflection.

We then declare our faith in the words of the Creed:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayers for ourselves, our church, our parish and our world, and may include the response:

Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

...Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
Amen

The Peace.

...The peace of the Lord be always with you!
And also with you.

The table is prepared.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**
Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

God's wonderful deeds are praised.

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Prayer of Thanksgiving continues as we remember the Last Supper.

One of these acclamations is used.

Great is the mystery of faith:
**Christ has died: Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.**

(or)

Praise to you, Lord Jesus:
**Dying you destroyed our death,
rising you restored our life:
Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

And at the end:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray
Our Father in heaven...

As the bread is broken:

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup,
we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Until we can all receive communion together, we pray:

Thanks be to you, Lord Jesus Christ, for all the benefits you have given me, for all the pains and insults you have borne for me. Since we cannot now receive you sacramentally (in bread and wine) I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, may I know you more clearly, love you more dearly, and follow you more nearly, day by day. Amen.

The Post Communion prayer is said.

*The Blessing is given., to which we respond **Amen.***

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.
In the name of Christ. Amen.
